Tanya was born in Miami, FL, the daughter of the late Thomas Henry White, Sr. and Gloria Knowles White. She was confirmed at Christ Episcopal Church in Coconut Grove, FL and transferred her membership with her parents to Ascension Episcopal Church. She was a 1970 graduate of Miami Killian Senior High School in Miami.

Tanya loved music and learned to play the piano at a very young age. She became the organist for Ascension Episcopal Church for three years before she left for college. She graduated from Fisk University in Nashville, TN, where she earned her B.A. degree in Elementary Education in 1974. While attending Fisk University, she was a member of the choir there, as well as playing the oboe for the Joint University Center Orchestra, an ensemble of musicians from Vanderbilt, Scarritt, and George Peabody College. While awaiting a teaching position, she worked at Dun and Bradstreet in Nashville.

Shortly after completing her B.A. requirements, Tanya was hired by Talbot County Public Schools, where she was a dedicated teacher for thirty years. She began her teaching career as a fifth grade teacher at Glenwood Elementary School, presently the W. Edward Dobson Building. She completed her graduate work at Bowie State University, receiving a Master's Degree in Elementary Education. She also did post-graduate work at the University of Miami, Coppin State University, Florida International University and Loyola University.

While at Glenwood, Tanya met Cargill Lawrence, and they married on August 12, 1977. They were blessed with one daughter, Catherine Inez Lawrence. At that time she and her husband became members of Scotts United Methodist Church.

Tanya's post retirement activities included being the musician for the Praised Choir at Scotts and later the organist for the Combined Choir, playing also at Mallard Bay Care Center and at other events. She was an election judge and a member of the United Methodist Women. She also enjoyed memberships in the Talbot County Retired School Personnel Association, the Maryland State Education Association, and the General Alumni Association of Fisk University. She was also an Associate Member of the Robert Russa Moton Alumni. She enjoyed being with her family, swimming, traveling, social networking, going to shows, cooking, dining out, watching reality shows and playing the piano.

Tanya leaves a large family to cherish her memory. This includes her husband of 35 years and her daughter; four sisters, Thomacina Brown and Tracy White of Miami, Tamara Gibson of Ft. Lauderdale, and Theresa Watson of Anaheim, CA; and a brother, Thomas White, Jr. of Miami. She also has three aunts and three uncles, as well as a host of in-laws, cousins, nieces, nephews and friends. She will be greatly missed.
