Great news! Due to the generous donations of our membership, amounting more than \$530.00, and some cuts in spending, we should have a balanced budget by the end of the year! Thank you to our dedicated and supportive membership

At last week's Executive Committee meeting, a lively discussion took place, regarding fundraising vs. membership fees vs. donations. Although the membership was very vocal at our last luncheon about not wanting to participate in fund raisers, some on the executive team think we should not totally rule this out for the future. Judy reported that if we were to raise fees to \$20, we would be on pare with three other counties. If we raised them to \$25, our fees would be the highest in the state. As our Membership Chair, she already has trouble attracting new members. Most of the other counties rely on donations to balance their budgets. The discussion will be continued at the February 9th Executive Meeting and all are invited to attend.

We are now an official Non-profit! The agreement is signed with The Mid-Shore Community Foundation. The donations that were made by our generous membership can be claimed on taxes. The Foundation will oversee our finances, and we are in the process of turning over our funds. From now on, if you need a check, a bill paid, or reimbursement please contact Jan McCrea or Pat Johnson. This move will simplify the job of the Treasurer and provide access to grant funds. We will abide by the Foundation's guidelines for fundraising. Checks must be made payable/mailed to the Mid-Shore Community Foundation, 102 East Dover Street, Easton, MD 21601 and the TCRSPA should be noted on the memo line. Through the Foundation we now can accept credit card donations online as well.

The Foundation requires every member organization to submit a **Mission Statement**. We reviewed ours, as written on our pamphlet.

"The Talbot County Retired School Personnel Association is a non-profit organization comprised of retired school system personnel. It serves as an

advocate for its members. The Organization is dedicated to excellence in education and lifelong learning. It promotes community service by its members through a myriad of volunteer activities."

It is curious that we have claimed to be a non-profit. The group was comfortable with the current Mission Statement so we will submit it ASAP. These are exciting times for our organization. There are many benefits that come with becoming a member organization with the Mid- Shore Community Foundation. We will be exploring all the different ways they can help as we continue to work the partnership.

Urgent Portal Directions

All of our members will need to set up a portal with the state pension system. As of next year, all communication will take place by portal and not by mail. Thank you to Pat Johnson for providing this cheat sheet.

- Go to: https://sra.maryland.gov/mysrps
- Click on the link that says "mySRPS login"
- Click on the link that says "Register"
- It will lead you through the steps to set up a personal account

Step 1: Prepare your information

Required for registration:

- Last name, last four digits of your Social Security number, and date of birth
- A valid government-issued ID, such as a driver's license, state ID, or passport, for the online identity verification process
- Your personal cell phone with a camera to take a "selfie" and a picture of your ID
- A strong password (at least eight characters, including one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter, and one number)

- Your personal email address (which will become your username)
- If you don't have a Registration Code: You may need to first go to the mySRPS website and click "Register." You'll be asked if you have a registration code. Click "no" and enter your personal information. A code will be mailed to your home address. You will need this code to complete registration, as it expires, so act quickly once you receive it, notes the Baltimore Teachers Union.

Step 2: Register on the website

- Go to the mySRPS website and click "mySRPS Login" or "Register".
- Follow the on-screen instructions to start the online identity verification process.
- You will be prompted to enter your personal information and use your phone's camera to take photos of your government-issued ID and a "selfie" for verification.
- If you encounter issues or are unable to complete the process online, contact Member Services for alternative methods.

Step 3: Complete your account setup

- Create your username (your email address) and password.
- Select and answer three challenge questions to secure your account.
- Enter your phone number and select the phone type.
- Agree to the Terms and Conditions.
- Click "Enroll" to submit your information.

Step 4: Activate your account

- Check your email for an activation email from mysrps@sra.state.md.us with the subject "Immediate action required".
- Click the link in the email to activate your account.

TCRSPA 2025-2026 ARTS AWARD RECIPIENT RAYMOND REMESCH

Ray Remesch grew up the oldest of four in Wye Mills. After graduating from Easton High School in 2003, he studied music at UMBC on full scholarship through the Linehan Artist Scholar program. He spent his 20's in Washington DC as a gigging musician, recording studio engineer and private music instructor.

In August of 2019, having returned to Talbot County a few years earlier, he accepted a part-time position teaching music at SMES and TES. During the COVID lockdowns of 2020 Ray began learning videography, primarily through weaving together music videos recorded one socially-distanced person at a time. In 2021, he became a full-time TCPS teacher. Recognizing the power of video in the age of social media, he started a Digital Arts class at TES where once a week, students of all ages spend their specials period learning photography, graphic design and videography. Ray directs an after-school band program consisting of guitars, bass guitar, pianos, drum set, ukuleles and violins.

Ray lives in Easton with his wife Ali, band director at Lockerman Middle School. Outside of school he stays musically active with the Spark in da Pan steel pan band, the Front Porch Orchestra bluegrass band, and community musical theater.
